

## Block Connector Role Description

The role of a **Block Connector** begins with interviewing, or better, having a conversation with twenty or so houses on their block, cul-de-sac or apartment building floor. It is our hope that this role continues on, unless the Block Connector is no longer interested or available, at which point they would let their **Connector Coordinator** know so that they together could find someone else on the block to take on the responsibility.

What we mean by the responsibility is that through the conversation process, the Block Connector becomes the “go to” person on their block. They are the person stewarding their neighbours’ emails and phone numbers; they know something about everyone on their block; they help neighbours welcome new neighbours; they are a key for their neighbours connecting to each other on the block and to the neighbourhood.

### Block Connectors commit to:

- Interviewing approximately half of their block (10 conversations) within \_\_\_\_\_ weeks of commitment (discuss with your Connector Coordinator)
- Submitting the conversation information to the neighbourhood Connector Coordinator for information entry (to facilitate connections among neighbours)
- Continuing conversations and ensuring they are finished by a determined date
- Attending Orientation/Conversation Brunches coordinated by the Connector Coordinator
- Planning a connection activity or event with their block
