What Do We Know About Good Governance?

That there are three tightly connected pieces of it:

- Fiduciary
- Strategic
- Generative



Evaluation

- Don't be intimidated by the idea
 - we engage in evaluation practices in our daily lives
 - it can be simple and straightforward to implement
